AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE VILLAGE OF PENINSULA ("VILLAGE") THROUGH THE MAYOR AND FISCAL OFFICER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE BOARD OF TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES OF BOSTON TOWNSHIP ("TOWNSHIP") FOR THE PURCHASE OF ROAD SALT AND *DECLARING AN EMERGENCY*

WHEREAS, the Village provides road salting services for roads within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council has determined that it desires to continue purchasing road salt from the Township; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Village to enter into an agreement for the immediate purchase of road salt, in order to provide road salting services to residents of the Village during the upcoming winter;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Peninsula, Summit County, Ohio, to-wit:

Section 1 Contract: The Mayor and Fiscal Officer are hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the Village, to enter a one-year contract, in the form attached and incorporated as Exhibit A, with the Township for purchase of road salt for \$39.84 per ton of salt purchased and \$3.00 per ton loaded for labor and associated costs.

Section 2 Severability: This Resolution and the various parts, sentences, paragraphs, sections, and clauses thereof are hereby declared to be severable. Should any part, sentence, paragraph, section, or clause be declared unconstitutional, null, or void by a court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration shall not have any effect on the validity of the remaining parts, sentences, paragraphs, sections, and clauses of this Resolution.


Section 3 Open Meeting: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the

public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4: Emergency: that this Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, comfort, convenience, and general welfare of the inhabitants. The extension of the Contract is necessary to ensure the citizens of the Village continue to receive waste and recyclable collection services and timely notice must be provided 180 days prior to the end of the term pursuant to the Contract terms. This Resolution has received the necessary number of votes to take effect and will be enforced from and after its passage at the earliest period allowed by law.

Section 5 Effective Date: This Resolution shall take effect on the 13 day of January 2014.




