A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE VILLAGE OF PENINSULA (“VILLAGE”) THROUGH THE MAYOR AND/OR FISCAL OFFICER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH BOSTON TOWNSHIP THE FOR THE PURCHASE OF ROAD SALT AND *DECLARING AN EMERGENCY*

WHEREAS the Village of Peninsula, Ohio wishes to purchase road salt from Boston Township for the upcoming winter months

WHEREAS the purchase of road salt from Boston Township is necessary for the maintenance of the roads in the Village.

WHEREAS the Village of Peninsula shall pay Boston Township \$54.97 per ton plus and additional \$3.00 per ton purchased for labor and associated costs for each ton of salt as set forth in the Agreement attached and marked Ex. A.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Peninsula, Summit County, Ohio, to-wit:

Section 1 The Mayor and/or Fiscal Officer are hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the Village to enter into the agreement with Boston Township for the purchase of road salt for the winter months at a cost of \$54.97 per ton plus an additional \$3.00 per ton for labor and associated costs per the Agreement attached and marked Exhibit A.


Section 2 Severability: This Resolution and the various parts, sentences, paragraphs, sections, and clauses thereof are hereby declared to be severable. Should any part, sentence, paragraph, section, or clause be declared unconstitutional, null, or void by a court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration shall not have any effect on the validity of the remaining parts, sentences, paragraphs, sections, and clauses of this Resolution.

Section 3 Open Meeting: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4: Emergency: that this Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, comfort, convenience, and general welfare of the inhabitants. This Resolution has received the necessary number of votes to take effect and will be enforced from and after its passage at the earliest period allowed by law.


Section 5 Effective Date: This Resolution shall take effect on the 14 day of December 2015.




