A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND FISCAL OFFICER TO APPROVE THE ORDER AND PURCHASE OF VEHICLES FROM LEBANONFORD FOR THE VILLAGE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village of Peninsula Police Department as part of the vehicle replacement and maintenance program has identified the need for replacement and increase in the number of police vehicles.

WHEREAS, the Peninsula Police Department has requested and received the required vehicle proposals from Lebanon Ford for the purchase of two vehicles. Said proposal attached and known as Exhibit A.

WHEREAS the Village Police Department asks for approval from this Council to order police vehicles.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Peninsula, Summit County, Ohio, to-wit:

Section 1 The Village Council hereby gives authority to the Mayor and Fiscal Officer to approve the order and purchase of two police vehicles as described and marked as Exhibit A.

Section 2 Open Meeting: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code


Section 3: Emergency: that this Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, comfort, convenience, and general welfare of the inhabitants. The services provided from the Contract are necessary to ensure the citizens of the Village continue receive waste and recyclable collection services and timely notice must be provided 180 days prior to the end of the term pursuant to the Contract terms. This Resolution has received the necessary number of votes to take effect and will be enforced from and after its passage at the earliest period allowed by law.

Section 4 Severability: This Resolution and the various parts, sentences, paragraphs, sections, and clauses thereof are hereby declared to be severable. Should

any part, sentence, paragraph, section, or clause be declared unconstitutional, null, or void by a court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration shall not have any effect on the validity of the remaining parts, sentences, paragraphs, sections, and clauses of this Ordinance.


Section 5 Effective Date: This Resolution shall take effect on the 26 day of February 2015


