The meeting was called to order by Council President Norman Rodatt. The meeting was set to discuss the fire contract with Valley Fire District. The price for contract is as follows:

Village--\$15,000.00 (includes National Park)

Township-\$48,000.00 (includes National Park)

This constitutes 25% for the village and 75% for the township.

A motion was made by Broderick that we proceed month by month until he received word from prosecuting attorney or attorney general as to a levy being established. This was not seconded.

Ordinance f/226 1982 was offered by Wright to amend Resolution #628-1976 entitled "establishing a Joint Fire District within the village of Peninsula and Boston Township, Summit County, Ohio, and declaring an emergency" by prohibiting the board of fire district trustees from levying a tax upon all taxable property of the Joint Fire District and declaring an emergency. Section 5 of Resolution #628-1976 which presently reads as follows, to-wit:

"The Board of Fire District trustees may exercise the same powers as are granted to a board of Township Trustees in Section 505.37 to 505.45 inclusive of the Ohio Rev. Code, including but not limited to the power to levy a tax upon all taxable property in the Fire District as provided in Section 505.39 of the Ohio Rev. Code. The Board of Fire District Trustees may execute any mutual aid contract which in the judgment of the Board is necessary to enhance fire protection within the Valley Fire District as well as surrounding areas."

shall be amended to read as follows, to-wit:

The Board of Fire District Trustees may exercise the same powers as are granted to a Board of Township Trustees in Section 505.37 to 505.45 inclusive of the Ohio Rev. Code, but excluding the power to levy a tax upon all taxable property in the Fire District as provided in Section 505.39 of the Ohio Rev. Code. The Board of Fire District Trustees may execute any mutual aid contract which in the judgment of the Board is necessary to enhance fire protection within the Valley Fire District as well as surrounding areas.

A motion to suspend the rules per sec. 731-17 ORC was made by Brunswick, and seconded by Ritch. Passed by majority with members voting Aye: Brunswick Rodatt, Ritch, Schneider, Wright, Wurzbacher, -Fisher and Schneider. One vote abstained -Broderick. The ordinance was seconded by Schneider, Sr. Passed by majority with members voting Aye: Brunswick, Rodatt, Ritch, Schneider, Wright, Wurzbacher, -Fisher and Schneider. One vote abstained -Broderick.

A motion was made by Schneider, seconded by Wright to authorize the clerk and mayor -trustee and clerk to enter into a contract with the Valley Fire District. Passed by majority with members voting Aye: Brunswick, Rodatt, Ritch, Schneider, Wright, Wurzbacher, -Fisher and Schneider. One vote abstained: Broderick.

A special meeting between Peninsula Village Council and the Boston Township trustees was called to order by Mayor Richard Fisher at 7:00 P.M. Present were Mayor Fisher, Councilmen Dan Schneider, Sr., Mike Ritch, Norman Rodatt, Dan Wurzbacher, Trustees: George Fisher, Jr., Dan Schneider, Jr., and Clerk Morgan and Peninsula Legal Advisor Lee Cole.

Purpose of the meeting was to discuss the proposed 1983 budget for the police department.

Mr. Wurzbacher explained that the department would have six full time men with no part time men. Total wages would be \$98,341.50, a 6% wage increase. Included in this amount is \$1000.00 for the captain for comp time. Benefits amount to \$32,557.33, Operating expenses - \$30,724.00, Capital Expenses - \$15,300.00. Total - \$176,922.83.

Mr. Fisher moved, and Mr. Wurzbacher seconded, that the budget of \$176,922.83 be accepted for the year 1983 with the Peninsula Council and Boston Trustees each paying half of same. All in favor.

Mr. Ritch asked if anything had been done regarding the cost of our own police and fire dispatching. Mr. Schneider, Jr., stated that a cost survey had been made and the cost per year would be approximately \$160,000.00 which would make it prohibitive for our territory.

Mr. Fisher, Jr., moved, and Mr. Schneider, Sr., seconded, to adjourn at 7:15 P.M. All in favor.

A joint meeting of Peninsula Council, Boston Twp. Trustees and Valley Fire Board was called to order by Mayor Fisher. Present were Councilmen Dan Schneider, Sr., Mike Ritch, Norman Rodatt, Dan Wurzbacher, Robert Brunswick, Legal Advisor Lee Cole - Trustees George Fisher, Jr., Dan Schneider, Jr., Clerk Morgan - Fire Board members George Fisher, Jr., Norman Rodatt, Tom Morehouse, Clerk Evelyn Kaczmariski, Fire Chief Morgan and Ass't Fire Chief Lahoski.

A motion by Schneider, Sr., seconded by Fisher, Jr., to excuse Carole Wright and Joseph Broderick. All in favor.

Purpose of the meeting was to discuss the proposed 1983 budget for the Valley Fire District.

The amount for salaries does not include the fire chief's salary as same is paid by Boston Township.

Regarding the options, Fire Chief Morgan stated that refurbishing truck one is the first priority as moisture is rusting metal and causing paint to peel off. The cost of refurbishing same is compared to replacing same at a cost of at least \$140,000.00. Estimates have been received from Ziss Products, J.C. Moore Co., and Sutphen Co. The truck would be up at least 90 days.

Refurbishing truck 1 was needed more than refurbishing truck 5, according to Chief Morgan.

Ass't Fire Chief Lahoski explained that the department now has four paramedics. In order to have contact with the hospitals the department's own channel is needed as channels with higher frequency will cut out our department. Dr. Frank, the fire department's medical advisor, states that it is necessary for the department to have its own channel if it is to run life support with City Hospital. The present system now goes through Cleveland and there is too much traffic on same. It should have its own channel with Akron.

Trustees George Fisher, Jr., and Dan Schneider, Jr., stated that they would provide Telemetry and drugs for the rescue squad in as much as the township

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had purchased same and had agreed to outfit same.

A motion by Schneider, Jr., seconded by Brunswick, to split the cost on truck 1 - Village 35.2% Township - 64.8%. All in favor.
