AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A LETTER AGREEMENT WITH THE CUYAHOGA VALLEY NATIONAL PARK FOR SEASONAL POLICE FOOT PATROL SERVICES IN THE VILLAGE'S CORE BUSINESS DISTRICT

WHEREAS, in past years, the Village and the Cuyahoga Valley National Park (the "Park") have entered into an agreement in which the Park pays the Village Police Department to perform seasonal foot patrol services in the Village's core business district; and

WHEREAS, the Park has requested that the Village enter into an agreement for the Park's 2017 Fiscal Year, which runs from October 1, 2016--September 30, 2017, based upon the terms and procedures set forth in the attached letter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Peninsula, Summit County, Ohio, to wit:

SECTION 1. Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to enter into the attached agreement with the Park for the performance of seasonal police foot patrols in the Village's core business district.

SECTION 2. All formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and all deliberations of this Council or any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.


SECTION 3. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village of Peninsula for the reason that it is necessary for the Village to receive compensation pursuant to the agreement, and therefore, this Resolution shall take immediate effect upon its passage.

SECTION 4. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect on the 14 day of November, 2016.



Re: Seasonal Foot Patrol in the Core Business District of the Village of Peninsula

Dear Mayor Mayer:

The National Park Service continues to support the partnership we have established with the Village of Peninsula to help provide park visitors with safe and enjoyable experiences in the Village. This letter, for the National Park Service's 2017 fiscal year, will describe the relationship and procedure for a one-time payment/reimbursement.

When able, and on the eligible days, the Village of Peninsula will provide an additional foot patrol officer. This officer will patrol the Core Business District during high visitation times (particularly due to the high volume of Towpath and train users), to exercise appropriate state and local law enforcement to protect visitors, resources, merchants, residents, and others.

As agreed in the past, to the extent practicable, the officer utilized for foot patrol will be a part-time rather than a full-time officer, and will work no more than an 8-hour shift, pursuant to the specific, daily circumstances in the Core Business District.

As always, during inclement weather, an additional foot patrol officer will not be on duty. The NPS support is provided to assist Peninsula with the influx of visitors in Peninsula due to the volume of Towpath and train users. Given that public visitation is reduced dramatically during inclement weather, an additional officer is not needed during these times.

During the NPS 2017 fiscal year, (Oct. 1, 2016 – Sept. 30, 2017), the Village may request a one-time payment for foot patrol services. The eligible dates for reimbursement are:

Wednesday – Sunday in October 2016

Weekends in April 2017

Friday – Sunday in May 2017

Seven days/week in June – August 2017

Wednesday - Sunday in September 2017 (this is subject to change based on CVSR's September schedule in 2017)

Please send monthly invoices on Village letterhead, in the format used this past year (Date, Officer, Hours, Hourly Rate, Total) via email to Jennifer McMahon at Jennifer_McMahon@nps.gov. Jennifer can be reached or 440-546-5908.


At whatever point in the fiscal year that the cap is reached (\$1500), we will issue a one-time reimbursement check for the total amount.

We appreciate your continued flexibility as we have gone through a number of procedural changes with this relationship. This relationship benefits the park, the Village, and our collective visitors, so we assume you wish to extend this arrangement, through this mechanism.


