RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SALE OF A 1993 INTERNATIONAL MODEL 4700 TRUCK AND A 1995 INTERNATIONAL MODEL 7400 TRUCK BY INTERNET AUCTION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Section 721.15 of the Ohio Revised Code authorizes the Village of Peninsula to sell personal property, including motor vehicles acquired for the use of municipal officers and departments, and road machinery, equipment, tools, or supplies, which is not needed for public use, or is obsolete or unfit for the use for which it was acquired, by internet auction; and

WHEREAS, the Village is the owner of a 1993 International Model 4700 truck and a 1995 International Model 7400 truck that are obsolete and no longer needed for public use; and

WHEREAS, Council of the Village of Peninsula believes the highest price for sale of the trucks will be obtained by selling the trucks by internet auction;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Peninsula, Summit County, Ohio, to wit:

Section 1 Statement of Intent: That the Village of Peninsula intends to sell the 1993 International Model 4700 truck and the 1995 International Model 7400 truck by an internet auction.

Section 2: Conduct of Auction: The said trucks will be listed on the internet auction website govdeals.com. Each truck shall be separately listed with a minimum bid price of \$4,500. Each truck shall be listed for a minimum of ten (10) days, including Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays. Each truck shall be delivered to the buyer within the Village of Peninsula or at the buyer's expense. The Mayor and Fiscal Officer are hereby authorized to take all actions necessary to list the trucks on govdeals.com consistent with the terms and conditions of govdeals.com provided such conditions are not contrary to those set forth above.

Section 3: Advertising: The Fiscal officer is authorized and instructed to publish, in a newspaper of general circulation in the Village, notice of the Village's intent to sell the trucks by internet auction. The notice shall include a summary of the information set forth in this resolution and shall be published twice. The second notice shall be published not less than ten nor more than twenty days after the first notice. The Fiscal Officer shall also post a copy of the notice continually throughout the calendar year in a conspicuous place in the Village Hall.


Section 4: Severability: This resolution and the various parts, sentences, paragraphs, sections, and clauses thereof are hereby declared to be severable. Should any part, sentence, paragraph, section, or clause be declared unconstitutional, null, or void by a court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration shall not have any effect on the validity of the remaining parts, sentences, paragraphs, sections, and clauses of this Resolution.

Section 5: Open Meeting: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 6: Emergency: That this Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and comfort; the specific necessity is the need to generate revenue for the Village during the current calendar year; and that the Resolution received the necessary number of votes to take effect and be enforced from and after its passage as it shall take effect and be enforced from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Section 5: Effective Date: This Resolution shall take effect on October 8, 2014.


